

Cobnor Weekend

17th - 19th October



Last Chance to sign up - Book now if you want to go!

Booking for our planned trip to the Cobnor Activity Centre for the weekend of 17th to 19th October closes at the end of June. Payment is only required once we confirm our booking in July.

Cost: £110 – includes accommodation, dinghies and great food. (£60 for instructors and powerboat crews)

Experience sailing in the beautiful tidal Chichester Harbour. Take your sailing to new levels or just enjoy the freedom of the open water.

These weekends are primarily aimed at our youth sailors (13 to 18 years), but if we have space then we are also happy to include adults or perhaps confident younger sailors. Ideally sailors will have achieved Stage 2 or Level 2, but this is not essential. Those with advanced skills such as RYA Seamanship can put these skills into practice.

We sail in Wayfarer dinghies belonging to CACT plus one or two of our RS Quests or 2000s. The Wayfarers take up to four crew including one of our instructors. The Quests and 2000s take three crew including one of our instructors. We put our more experienced sailors in the Quests so that they can experience sailing with a symmetric spinnaker and trapeze.

As an RYA Training Centre, we are not allowed to run RYA courses away from Hedgecourt Lake, but that does not mean we can't have a great time and learn new skills. Sailing in a tidal harbour is very different from sailing on Hedgecourt lake; tides, waves, steady winds, moored boats and racing fleets all add to the challenge and interest.







Two more very successful Cruises

Sunday 27th April was another excellent cruise. I was not present for this one as Jane and I were celebrating our 40th wedding anniversary but Ian Michell gave me a brief account from which I prepared this report. Three boats took part, Ian and Kathy in a Comet Versa, Dave Monk and Kevin Egan in another Comet Versa and Kevin East solo in his Wanderer. The winds were light to start with so they motored out of Itchenor initially before running down the Thorney channel to Prinsted where they lunched. The stop also included the mandatory visit to the nearby Scout Hut for home made cake. Lemon drizzle cake and Bakewell tart were reported to be the favourites. This was followed by a nice beat back up to East Head with the tide then a lovely sail back to Itchenor against the tide though which was not as hard going as on the previous cruise. Saturday 17th May was our supported cruise designed to encourage novice cruisers and members with slower boats. Seven boats took part. I was joined at Cobnor by Simon and Jim, both CMYC Level 2 graduates neither of whom had sailed dinghies on tidal water before. There we met with other Cobnorites, Patrick and Liz in a Wanderer and Paul Hewett with David Edgar also in a Wanderer. Paul promised to join the cruise when his schedule allowed! We crossed over to Itchenor to meet the others and held a briefing there. Mark and Gill had brought their Wayfarer, Rachel Danvers also crewed. Kathy Lugt and Ian Michel joined up with Kevin East in his Hartley Wanderer as they are considering buying one. Brian Dart was sailing solo in his Versa, Sara Peay and her brother, Paul were in Sarah's traditional Swallows and Amazons dinghy. Finally Neil and Angela were in the club RIB. The winds were light and we made our way slowly against the tide towards East Head. We were soon passed by Paul and Dave making directly for East Head using the outboard! As we approached Pilsey the wind changed direction and increased. The sea breeze had settled in and the sun was shining. Wonderful. We picnicked ashore on East head and just enjoyed the sunshine. After lunch we sailed towards Hayling to enjoy the sea breeze. Sarah and Paul had a capsize off East Head and were assisted by the support boat. We then sailed back in convoy via Birdham pool to Itchenor. It was a very enjoyable sail and I am pleased to report that my bow tank was completely dry when I removed the bung!

On behalf of those present may I say a big thank you to Neil and Angela for collecting, towing and crewing the support boat. It is an all day duty but it is what makes our cruising programme possible. Thank you both.

On **Saturday 14th June** we hope to use the High spring tide to explore the upper reaches of Portsmouth Harbour, starting from Hardway SC. Detail are on the Website. Dave Monk will lead this one. Portsmouth Harbour is pretty sheltered so we do not plan to bring a support boat. High Water is at 14.31. Height 4.4m. Range 3.3m.

There's also great shopping and an Art Gallery a few miles drive away at Chichester;

The camping will be in the fields owned by the Beale family on the Cobnor estate. The facilities are basic but the surroundings beautiful. The camping charges are reasonable. Children are very welcome but are the responsibility of their parents at all times. Dogs are permitted. Plan to arrive on the Thursday evening or anytime Friday, pitch your tent in the field and get your boat ready for sailing on the Saturday. We plan to have powerboat support on the Saturdays. Dinghies are launched from the estate slipway at Cobnor. Boats are required to display a valid harbour plaque. RYA Dinghy Sailing Course for Adults

Start Sailing - Level 1 & Basic Skills - Level 2



Course Fee per person using a club boat: £175

Course Fee per person using own boat: £150

(If you wish to use your own boat, it must be a suitable double handed dinghy large enough for 3 adults)

All course training books and certificates are included in the cost of the course.

This four-day course covers the Start Sailing and Basic Skills syllabi from the RYA National Sailing Scheme. No previous sailing experience is necessary. The course provides a basic knowledge and understanding of dinghy sailing. On successful completion of the course, you will be able to handle a dinghy competently in light wind conditions.

This course is essentially a practical one giving instruction in the basic techniques needed to rig a dinghy. launch, leave the shore, sail around a course involving all points of sailing and return to land. Practical sessions are held on Hedgecourt Lake. Theory sessions required to support the practical aspects of the course along with briefings will be held in the CMYC Clubhouse. The emphasis is very much on a safe, seamanlike approach to sailing.

For this course we use appropriate double-handed dinghies, club dinghies include: RS Quests; Laser 2000; Wanderers and Topaz Omega. You may also use your own boat provided it is capable of holding three adults and considered suitable for the course.

The course is intended for adults and older teenagers, as younger members will have the opportunity to join the RYA Youth Sailing Scheme Stage 1 & Stage 2 course running on the same four days, details elsewhere.

RYA Young Sailors

Stage 1 & 2 Course

Course Fee: £110 - for those using their own Topper **Course Fee: £135** - for those using a club Topper

All course training books and certificates are included in the cost of the course.

Day 1 – Saturday 21st June; 9:00 – 17:00

Day 2 - Sunday 22nd June; 9:00 - 17:00

Day 3 - Saturday 28th June; 9:00 - 17:00

Day 4 - Sunday 29th June; 9:00 - 17:00



This course is ideal for complete beginners and for those who have been attending Junior Saturday Clubs, it will teach the basics for beginners and reinforce knowledge gained previously and expand on this for those with some experience. This course covers Stage 1 & Stage 2 of the RYA Youth Sailing Scheme and is open to young sailors aged 10 to 15 years. It runs concurrently with the adult course, giving parents the opportunity to achieve RYA Level 2 at the same time.

By the end of the course the young sailors will be safety conscious and able to rig and sail a dinghy confidently in light winds. Toppers dinghies will be used and each sailor will be in a boat on their own. Please be aware there are a limited number of club Toppers available and you should use your own Topper if you have one. Numbers on the course are also limited by the number of instructors available. All sessions are held at CMYC.

Due to strong wind and unpredictable gusts some of the AM Oppies got a little wet and cold which meant the usual three Oppie 'Fun Racers' needed to stay ashore and warm up. We do hope the weather is a little kinder In June so they are able to join us for the Fun Race this month.

Dan ran the new Race Coaching session which helped prepare those sailing in the Fun Race, so when booking in on webcollect do indicate if you want to do the Race Coaching session. Many thanks to Dan, Ollie, Geoff, Alison and Maxine for help with coaching and recording laps.

If you can tack, gybe and sail a triangle you should be able to take part in the Fun Race. It is only 25 minutes long. There will be a support boat and instructors on the water giving help and advice.

How to take part in the Fun Race:

AM sailors can use the same boat they used in their morning session.

PM sailors – if you want to race, indicate this when booking and a boat can be saved for you. Be ready to go on the water by 12.40 so that we can start the race and finish in time for you to be ready for your PM sailing session.

Sign on – Outside the clubhouse there will be a signing on sheet for you to put your name on – please make sure it is clear - along with the other information required (there will be someone there to help if you are not sure where and what to put).

Briefing: Before the race the Race Officer will explain where the race will be and the marks to go around. They will also explain how you will know when the race is about to start and stop. **At 12.40 - Head out to the starting area** by the Maid of Kent.

P.S. Do remember to wear some warm waterproof clothing (plus hat and gloves) as the water is still cold and doesn't really warm up until the end of June!

Looking forward to seeing you at the June 'Fun Race' and it would be great to see some new Topper and Oppie sailors having a go, along with some Fevas and Laser 4.7's

Junior Helm Week

18th - 22nd August

Our week of fun sailing for juniors is on the horizon. Booking will be open from 21st June until 19th July, full details of how-to book are on the WebCollect Junior Helm Week page (log in then go to

https://webcollect.org.uk/cmyc/category/junior-helm-week). The cost will be £60, the same as last year. You can book either mornings (10:00 to 12:30) or afternoons (13:30 to 16:00), but not both. A member of your family who is not a member in their own right and is not covered by family membership may only be booked onto the waiting list. Oppies (for those 6 to 10 years old) will use club boats. Toppers (for those 10 to 15 years old) should use their own boat if they have one, club boats will be available for those who don't have their own. The great egg boat race will be held during the Friday lunch break, more details nearer the time.



WE NEED YOUR HELP! Junior Helm Week has always relied on volunteer helpers which is why the costs are so favourable. Safety on and off the water is the highest priority. We need parents, grandparents, instructors, first aiders, and support boat helms. Even if you can only manage half a day, it will be a great help, but ideally at least two sessions. We need help with: rigging, launching, making tea and myriad other activities that go into making the week a success. We value the experience of those who have helped in previous years and welcome new volunteers who will be shown exactly what to do – no experience necessary! Need a Topper for a Year For £100?

The club has two Toppers available for hire for £100 each for the year. The £100 contributes to the boat park space and insurance costs.

Each boat has its own trolley. The loanee will be expected to look after the boat and equipment during the loan period, taking the sail, rudder, daggerboard and ropes home with them. This keeps them safe and allows freedom of use. We ask that the boats are made available for any Junior Helm Week sessions that you are not using them, should we need them.

These loans would be best suited to those who intend to use the boats for more than just Saturday Clubs, perhaps to join in some races or just family sailing.
