This is just some of what's going on, please ask if you want to know more.

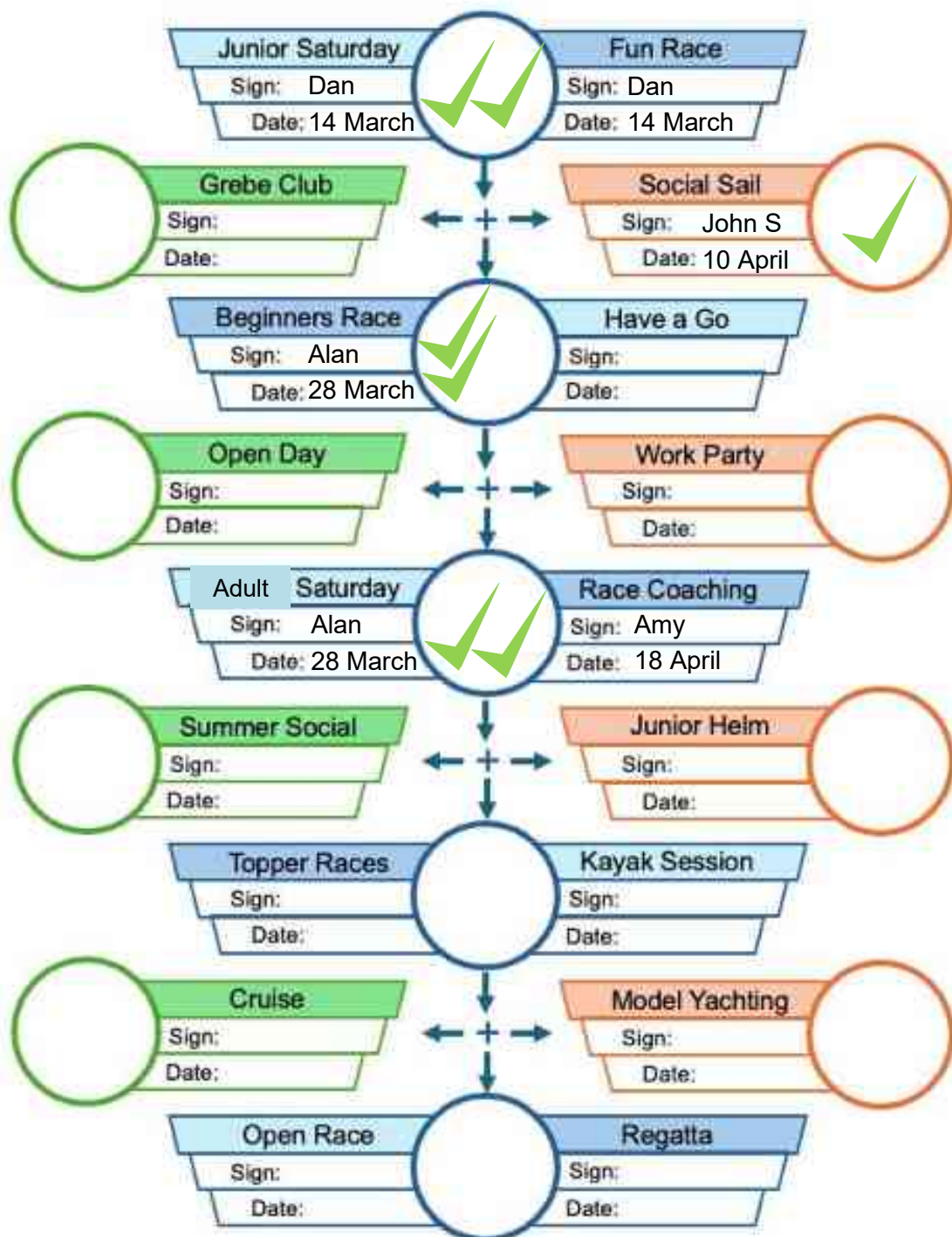


“Have a Go” Racing



Women on Water

The club is pleased to continue offering Women on Water, a monthly sailing opportunity designed for women who would like to experience sailing in a relaxed and supportive environment. The sessions are also a great opportunity for non-sailing members who are curious about the sport, as well as those whose partners or children already sail and would like to try it for themselves.

Women on Water runs once a month on Friday evenings from April to August, with dates for the 2026 season listed below. The group meets at 6.00pm, with the aim of being on the water between 6.30pm and 7.00pm and returning to shore by sunset. While weather conditions vary, an evening on the lake provides a rewarding and enjoyable end to the week.

The group operates on a friendly and informal basis, and no prior sailing experience is required. Participants do not need to own a boat, space for crew is usually available on member's boats or, on suitable club boats, subject to instructors' availability.

A WhatsApp group is used to share updates, and a reminder for each session is circulated on the Monday preceding the event.

Members who are interested in taking part are warmly encouraged to join the group and enjoy an accessible introduction to sailing in a supportive setting.

Boat Sticker – What did you think I meant?!

We are currently carrying out an audit of the Boat Park. More than 30 boats have so far been identified whose owners have not renewed their subscriptions.



Some of these may have just forgotten to renew – if that's you, please put it right straight away.

Others have been taking up space in our boat park for more than a year without renewing and are being considered as abandoned. Boats suspected to be abandoned will be moved to make more space for current members' boats, support our plans to re-group training boats, provide a designated area where more than one boat may be stored in each boat space and reorganise the space for Sailability and growth – Open Day is just around the corner and new members are always seeking boat park spaces.



To avoid confusion, it is essential that members put this year's sticker on their boat as soon as possible.

If you are a current member whose boat doesn't have a sticker, your boat could get moved by mistake and you'd risk losing your present boat space. (If that happens, we'll do our best to put it right, but don't blame the volunteers who are trying to improve the boat park for the benefit of all.) Please also refer to the Club's Byelaws for details.

Stickers are in the top drawer of the filing cabinet in the corner of the clubhouse. If you haven't already done so, please get your sticker and put it on your boat straight away.

Members who have more than one boat in the same space (including kayaks), can get additional stickers from Membership Secretary, Julian. A contribution to club funds of £1.00 per additional sticker is suggested to cover the cost of printing these little beauties.

Cobnor Weekend – 23rd to 25th October



Cost: £130

Experience sailing in the beautiful tidal Chichester Harbour. Take your sailing to new levels or just enjoy the freedom of the open water.

These weekends are primarily aimed at our youth sailors (13 to 18 years), but if we have space then we are also happy to include adults or perhaps confident younger sailors. Ideally sailors will have achieved Stage 2 or Level 2, but this is not essential. Those with advanced skills such as RYA Seamanship can put these skills into practice.

A typical weekend starts with arrivals between 17.30 and 19:00 on Friday, in time for an evening meal. There is some flexibility and later arrival or arrival before 8:00 on Saturday can be accepted. On Saturday morning we sail locally for a couple of hours, possibly up towards Bosham or down into the Chichester Channel depending on the tide and wind, returning to CACT for lunch. In the afternoon we venture further afield, to Dell Quay if tides and wind permit. On Saturday evening, we have a wholesome meal followed by games. Then on Sunday we typically sail west toward Hayling Island and stop for a snack on East Head before returning to CACT for a late lunch. After lunch everyone helps clear up so that we are ready to leave by 16:00.

We sail in Wayfarer dinghies belonging to CACT plus one or two of our RS Quests or 2000s. The Wayfarers take up to four crew including one of our instructors. The Quests and 2000s take three crew including one of our instructors. We put our more experienced sailors in the Quests so that they can experience sailing with a symmetric spinnaker and trapeze.

As an RYA Training Centre, we are not allowed to run RYA courses away from Hedgecourt Lake, but that does not mean we can't have a great time and learn new skills. Sailing in a tidal harbour is very different from sailing on Hedgecourt lake; tides, waves, steady winds, moored boats and racing fleets all add to the challenge and interest.



Cobnor Weekend – 23rd to 25th October



Accommodation is in a log cabin bunkhouse, with two to eleven beds per room.

All this requires support, we need one person to manage the catering and run the galley and one person to support them in the galley, these people may also sail or act as powerboat crew if qualified (please contact Jeff before booking either of these), We also need powerboat helms and dinghy instructors. If parents are able to help that is ideal. We are flexible and can work with anyone wishing to sail or powerboat and run the galley.

We will run two powerboats, each having a crew of two, both of whom must be RYA Powerboat Level 2 qualified and one must also be Safety boat qualified.

Places can be requested via WebCollect <https://webcollect.org.uk/cmhc/> from 1st May until 30th June, Please DO NOT pay until places have been confirmed, shortly after 30th June. You will receive an email confirming your place, or if oversubscribed we may have to prioritise who places are allocated to.

IMPORTANT: Please will all those wishing to attend (instructors, powerboat, helpers and sailors) complete the WebCollect request.

Fun Races run between AM and PM group sessions at Saturday Club and offer extra sailing with additional coaching. You will be surprised how much your sailing improves, even after just a few races. A support boat and instructor will be on the water giving help and advice. If you can tack, gybe and sail a triangle it will be easy for you to take part, and the race is only 20 minutes. There is always someone who can help get your boat on and off the water and get out to the start line.

For those new to the fun race.

1. **If you are using a club boat**, ask an instructor to allocate you one and if you have your own boat do ask if you need help with your rigging.
2. **Sign on** – Outside the clubhouse there will be a form to complete.
3. **Briefing:** The person running the race will blow a whistle, by the Clubhouse, before you race and explain where the race will be and the marks to go around.

We Look forward to seeing you and it is great to see new sailors having a go. If you want to join in the race do indicate this when booking in. – Diana

Powerboat refresher

This month we have two powerboat refresher sessions, one on 17th May alongside the 'Get On the Water Challenge' - no booking but email Mike S if interested, the other as part of Adult Saturday Club, for which places are limited to two per morning, booking will be via WebCollect - Adult Saturday Club.

Junior Saturday Club

Topper Coaching 18th April

We had a fantastic Topper coaching session recently, with four keen boats making the most of a gentle breeze. The morning session was focused on perfecting boat handling and mastering the start line.

In the afternoon, the sailors put their training to the test by joining the Adult "Have a Go" race, followed by the monthly serious race. It was a brilliant opportunity to practice skills alongside different boats and prepare for the Topper open. The group did incredibly well, holding their own against a mixed fleet. Well done to all the sailors who took part and thank you to the race officers who supported and assisted our sailors.

Adult Saturday Club & Powerboat Refresher

A couple of cancellations meant that we only had three booked to sail, however a number of other members turned up to sail without requiring instructor assistance as well as four Toppers receiving race coaching, so the lake was pleasantly busy. It was a lovely day with an ideal wind strength although as usual the direction was quite variable. Thanks to Mike T, Caroline and Alan for instructing. There were no takers for the powerboat refresher this month.



RYA Dinghy Sailing Course for Adults

Start Sailing – Level 1 & Basic Skills – Level 2



**Course Fee per person using a club boat:
£180**

Course Fee per person using own boat: £155
(If you wish to use your own boat, it must be a suitable double handed dinghy large enough for 3 adults)

All course training books and certificates are included in the cost of the course.

This four-day course covers the Start Sailing and Basic Skills syllabi from the RYA National Sailing Scheme. No previous sailing experience is necessary. The course provides a basic knowledge and understanding of dinghy sailing. On successful completion of the course, you will be able to handle a dinghy competently in light wind conditions.

This course is essentially a practical one giving instruction in the basic techniques needed to rig a dinghy, launch, leave the shore, sail around a course involving all points of sailing and return to land. Practical sessions are held on Hedgecourt Lake. Theory sessions required to support the practical aspects of the course along with briefings will be held in the CMYC Clubhouse. The emphasis is very much on a safe, seamanlike approach to sailing.

For this course we use appropriate double-handed dinghies, club dinghies include: RS Quests; Laser 2000; Wanderers and Topaz Omega. You may also use your own boat provided it is capable of holding three adults and considered suitable for the course.

The course is intended for adults and older teenagers, as younger members will have the opportunity to join the RYA Youth Sailing Scheme Stage 1 & Stage 2 course running on the same four days, details elsewhere.

Day 1 – Saturday 20th June; 9:00 – 17:00

Day 2 – Sunday 21st June; 9:00 – 17:00

Day 3 – Sunday 28th June; 9:00 – 17:00

Day 4 – Saturday 4th July; 9:00 – 17:00



Booking via Web Collect from 1st April 2024

(This may all seem a bit early but Open Day is on 10th May this year, so to avoid disappointment, book before then.)

Payment is required by the 14th June and should be made by bank transfer if possible.

RYA Young Sailors Stages 1 & 2 Course

Course Fee: £115 - for those using their own Topper

Course Fee: £140 - for those using a club Topper

All course training books and certificates are included in the cost of the course.

Day 1 – Saturday 20th June; 9:00 – 17:00

Day 2 – Sunday 21st June; 9:00 – 17:00

Day 3 – Sunday 28th June; 9:00 – 17:00

Day 4 – Saturday 4th July; 9:00 – 17:00



This course is ideal for complete beginners and for those who have been attending Junior Saturday Clubs, it will teach the basics for beginners and reinforce knowledge gained previously and expand on this for those with some experience. This course covers Stage 1 & Stage 2 of the RYA Youth Sailing Scheme and is open to young sailors aged 10 to 15 years. It runs concurrently with the adult course, giving parents the opportunity to achieve RYA Level 2 at the same time.

By the end of the course the young sailors will be safety conscious and able to rig and sail a dinghy confidently in light winds. Toppers dinghies will be used and each sailor will be in a boat on their own. Please be aware there are a limited number of club Toppers available and you should use your own Topper if you have one. Numbers on the course are also limited by the number of instructors available. All sessions are held at CMYC.

Booking opens via Web Collect on 1st April 2025
