How Your Club Operates

CMYC is an incorporated organisation with limited liability. The committee members are directors of the company. The management and operation of the club is primarily defined by the CMYC Articles of Association, a legal document that can only be changed by agreement of the members at an AGM. What is Expected of You

The CMYC Bye-Laws define what you can and cannot do at the Club, together with the Club's and your responsibilities. It is important that you familiarise yourself with the Bye-Laws. One of which requires each main member and active sailing family member, of 18 and over, to carry out duties as prescribed in the New Member Application or Renewal documentation. Also, there is a Code of Conduct, which outlines what the Club expects of its members.

Sailing Related Information

Support boat and Race Officers

Events on the lake may have support boat cover and a race duty crew if racing is included, guidelines are in place for both of these activities.

Information for Race Officers is provided in the Dinghy Racing Information on page 7. Support boat and race duty crews are mostly performed by members as part of their obligatory duties (Bye-Law 9). Duty crews should arrive no later than one-hour before the time shown on Dutyman (that is the race start time). It is the member's responsibility to arrange a swap if they are unable to undertake an allocated duty. Duty swaps can be requested via Dutyman. As a last resort contact the Duties officer at duties@cmyp.co.uk.

Support Boat Operating Guidelines Hedgecourt – these guidelines are geared towards supporting racing, but should be read by anyone providing support boat cover at Hedgecourt. (Website - Members Area -> Policies and Documents).

Thursday Informal Sailing

This provides a friendly daytime sailing opportunity for those members who enjoy sailing in company. The aim is to be on the water from around 10:30. At times there may be powerboat support, but participating helms are reminded that, at all times, they remain solely responsible for any decision to sail and for the suitability of the boat and the safety of its occupants.

This is an informal event for anyone who is available during the day on Thursdays. Experiment with your rigging, perhaps pick up tips from others and have an enjoyable sail around Hedgecourt. Thursday Sailing is above all an opportunity to enjoy Hedgecourt in company when it is not being used for organised events.

Crawley Mariners Ladies meet once a month, on Friday evenings, over the summer for a social sail.

We have lots of different types of sailors - many of them are looking to improve their skills and/or confidence. Some are new members who like to continue their practice following the RYA course, some who have been members for many years but did not get out on the water for a while and some mums of youth sailors who are too busy getting their children ready, or volunteer on Saturday clubs and run out of time to get on the water themselves.

There is no formal training during these evenings but lots of friendly competent sailors are happy to share their knowledge and experience. For these sessions no need for your own boat or need to sail solo.

Before darkness we return to shore, de-rig the boats and sometimes have a bite to eat and a natter.

So, if you're a Crawley Mariners lady, who'd like to brush up on her skills, come along and find out more about it.

Have a Go at Racing and Sunday Afternoon Social Sailing

On these afternoons there will be a powerboat in attendance to give support to those less experienced sailors who might otherwise lack confidence to venture out. Dinghy Racing Information

Separate racing series take place over a number of weeks on Wednesday evenings, Saturdays and Sundays. There are also one day events. Refer to the 'At a Glance' programme on the inside cover for brief details of which series run on which days and dates. There is a specific series, the Beginners Race, for members who are starting to race or who have not won a series - series winning helms are excluded. Adult and Junior Helms with Level 2/Stage 2 or equivalent experience are encouraged to participate in races, as this is a great way to learn about racing and to improve your sailing skills.

Saturday Clubs are held monthly from March to November. Sessions for adults and juniors are held on separate days. Club boats are available for members to use if they don't have a suitable boat of their own. The Saturday Clubs are structured informal training sessions run by our qualified instructors. These provide an opportunity to have your first sailing experience, or to revise and improve your sailing techniques, such as those learned on a Level 2 course, through to honing your skills for racing. RYA Recognised Training Centre

CMYC is an RYA Recognised Training Centre (RTC), this allows us to run RYA dinghy sailing, powerboat and navigation theory courses for which we have recognition, issuing internationally recognised certificates to those who attain the required standard. To maintain our RTC status we must have certain procedures in place to ensure we meet the RYA's requirements. There is also an annual inspection.

Refer to the CMYC website (Sailing Activities -> Training Activities) to find out more about the courses being offered.

- CMYC RYA Recognised Training Centre Operating Procedures – these detail how training at the club is run, including instructor student ratios, support boat ratios and much more.
- CMYC RYA Recognised Training Centre Staff Training – Although we don't have paid staff we do offer or help to source training for those working, albeit voluntarily, as part of the RTC.
- CMYC Good Practice Guide for Instructors, Coaches and Volunteers – further guidance on how anyone instructing, coaching or assisting should behave.

CMYC is a recognised ICC Test Centre enabling it to issue certificates of competence for helms of powerboats up to 10m.

CMYC is a member of RYA Onboard, which provides additional resources and encouragement for working with young people.

Open Water Swimming

Members may use Hedgecourt Lake for Open Water swimming during defined periods. During these periods, no craft are allowed on the lake other than canoes, kayaks and paddleboards. Water quality is checked frequently and swimming will be suspended during periods of poor water quality. Members will be notified of the latter via email.

- Open Water Swimming Bye-Law Adherence Declaration – A declaration to be signed by those joining CMYC as CMYC Open Water Swimming Members
- Open Water Swimming Risk Assessment – An assessment of the risk and any mitigation with various aspects of OWS.
- Open Water Swimming Safety Briefing – A briefing that should be read by all swimmers.

Paddlesports

Weekly instructed Kayak Sessions for all abilities and ages run from Monday 13th April until Monday 7th September. Club Kayaks are available. Each session aims for an hour on the water with 15 minutes before to set-up and 15 minutes after to clear away. Sessions are booked via WebCollect.

Members may Kayak or Stand-Up Paddleboard at any time between sunrise and 30 minutes after sunset. If kayaking in a closed kayak, then a minimum of two must always be afloat and in company (Ref. Bye-Law 7.3).
